The other two men advanced to right and left of the chain, each measuring the diameter of the trees on his side within 33 feet of the chain. These measurements were obtained by calipers, and were taken at breastheight, or 4 feet above the ground. Red and Black Spruce and Balsam were calipered to 5 inches, and Pine, Hemlock, and the hardwoods to 10 inches, only sound trees being taken. One thousand and eighty valuation survey acres were measured on the township, distributed as follows among the forest types: Spruce Land, 953; Swamp, 90; Upper Spruce Slope, 37. Disregarding the Upper Spruce Slope, there are 1,043, so that for every 16 acres of merchantable forest land 1 acre has been measured. Together with the valuation surveys, the height of the principal species was obtained by actual...
